INTEREST GROUP EVENT: PANEL DISCUSSION

On 16 May 2014, the Interest Group, in close cooperation with the Centre for Migration Law of the Radboud University Nijmegen and the Amsterdam Center for International Law of the University of Amsterdam, organized a panel discussion on migration by sea in the Mediterranean, entitled 'Heading to Europe: Safe Haven or Graveyard?'. The panel discussion brought together about 50 scholars, government officials and practitioners working in the field of migration and refugee law and policy.

The panel discussion made clear that the European rules regulating migration by sea do not always have the intended effect of decreasing the number of arrivals in Europe. Therefore, it is important to critically reflect on the legal framework, bearing in mind that the developments at the external borders cannot be viewed in isolation. Read more here.
